**GLUSTIEN, Aaron Eric 1920-2016**

**A Canadian War Hero**

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Aaron Eric Glustien at Sunnybrook Hospital, Toronto, on November 3, 2016, surrounded by his loving family. He was born in Romney, USSR, on January 15, 1920, the son of Kalman and Sonya, and had five sisters. He immigrated with his family to Canada at the age of two, fleeing the Russian Revolution, and they initially settled in New Waterford, Cape Breton, Nova Scotia. He had an early life of academic awards and athletic achievements, while helping his father run the family business. At the age of 19, at the start of WWII, he enlisted in the RCAF, where over his war career he was defined as a true Canadian hero.

During his military service, he was awarded many medals for his extreme courage and bravery. He completed two tours of duty with Allied Bomber Command, the second tour serving as a member of the Pathfinder Crew in the RCAF. His crew had one of the most dangerous jobs in the war.

Bomber crews were men with the quality of high courage. What made these fly boys heroes was defying fear, raid after terrifying raid. Among his many medals for bravery, he was awarded the highest honour, the Distinguished Flying Cross (DFC) for his unshakable determination to accomplish the missions against incredible odds.

During the Blitz in London, he met the love of his life, Joan, who was serving in the RAF. They fell instantly in love, and enjoyed 70 years of a wonderful, joyous marriage. Eric was an amazing husband, devoted father and friend, a stargazer with a passion for astronomy, a Scrabble and crossword puzzle champ, and was always a sports enthusiast. A man of great intelligence, he had an early aptitude for mathematics and technical skill, which led him to be an outstanding navigator, achieving the Master Navigator designation, and went on to an extremely successful post-war career with IBM.

His devotion to his family, and a strong moral sense defined him. He was the foundation of strength and steadiness to them all. He and his adored wife Joan moved with their children numerous times, throughout Canada and the United States, but wherever they went, they al-

ways created a circle of new friends and contributed to each community. One of the favourite times of his life, was his retirement in Vero Beach, Florida, visited endlessly by his large and growing family. Predeceased two years ago by his loving wife, he is survived by his two sisters, Evelyn Wiggins and Dorothy Tomarin; his five children, Mel (Judy Briggs), Penny (Stan Gottfried), Bob (Stephanie Shorter), Shari (Ted Darby), and Mallory (Lori Janzen); his grandchildren, Jayson, Nicolas (Kyla), Michael (Jaime), Amanda, Joshua, Jeremy, Katherine, James, Lauren, Elyse, Jessica, Sascha, Brandon and Kai; as well as his great-grandchildren, AJ and Aria, Tristan and Adria, Lauren and Cole.

Eric inspired us all with his passion for life, his sense of humour (and relentless puns), a respect for, and pride in his children and grandchildren, and his 'coolness'. His varied successful careers in business, aviation, and computers with IBM, allowed him to devote his retirement years to enjoying his family, friends, and his eternal love affair with Joan. Eric enjoyed his wonderful life and lived it with exceptional bravery, class, humility, a keen mind, and vitality. Although he has slipped 'the surly bonds of Earth', by now his calm and steady soul will have found its way to Joan and he will be whole once more. It will take a lot more than mere death to keep those two apart. We are lucky to have had such a good man as a father. He will be so missed.

There has been a private family service, and there will be a full military memorial at the National Military Cemetery in Ottawa at a later time, date to be confirmed.
