EULOGY of Myer Rabin, z"l, past president of Tiferes Israel**Rabbi YAGOD**

We are gathered here today to honor the life and memory of a very noble member of our community, Myer Rabin. The name Myer translates in Hebrew to mean “one who brings light “. Myer’s trademark smile brought light to any room he was in. Myer had much wisdom and could brighten up any situation with his calm and wise analysis. I often enjoyed his wise counsel when discussing my weekday commercial endeavors with him. There is a Hebrew expression “DERECH-ERETZ” which translates to ways of respect, good manners, civility, honesty and sincere kindness. Myer was a shining example of “DERECH-ERETZ”. Myer’s numerous leadership roles in the shul were always carried out in the spirit of DERECH-ERETZ. It should be noted that on average the typical synagogue relationships between the Rabbi and the President or Vice President is fraught with potential and actual conflicts and is the stuff of lively legends. Myer was above all of that; he had a high standard of DERECH ERETZ. I can tell you that I never once heard from him a distressing comment, never once an unkind word, never once a tone of upset. I will always remember his unfailing respect. Just over two weeks ago I visited him in the hospital and he still had that trademark optimism and spoke calmly and peacefully. Although he was not feeling well, he made sure to inquire in his ever-gracious way about how I was doing! Imagine, he was in the hospital for a most dreadful illness and yet he was inquiring about how I am doing! He prayed right here in this synagogue and always brought a measure of tranquility with him. He served this shul in many ways and his passing leaves a great void. It is hard to believe that he was just sitting here a few weeks ago in the synagogue with his trademark smile. Myer’s exceptional ways of DERECH ERETZ will serve as an unforgettable inspiration to all of us. We will miss you Myer, but, G-d willing, we won’t forget you.
