MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

September 2020

The new year is starting soon.

Rosh HaShana 5781 will start Friday night, September 18.

On behalf of the members of the board, **David Rinzler, Rhonda Rubin, Carole Savage, John Flanagan, Anne Jochelman, Theodore Lewis, Lee Wilson, Alexander Izichkis, Betty Rubin and Jordan Davidson** and also on behalf of **Rebbetzin and Rabbi Yagod**, let me wish to all of you a very Happy and Sweet Year.

It is with regret that we will miss, this year, the wonderful voice on the Bimah of **Yaakov Brummer**. He and his brother **Shlomo** (Hazzan in Bangor) gave a year ago a beautiful concert of Jewish songs, a concert that was open to the public.

Looking back in the archives I see that I started writing a bulletin for the synagogue in September 1997. I was taking over from **Andrew and Marjorie Gann**, who had done the monthly bulletins for a year. Twenty-three consecutive years of bulletins – published on an average of four times a year ... will be reaching soon the one hundred mark!

Sometimes I wonder to which extent these bulletins are read... what about you? I seldom

get any feedback and thus can't help to wonder if it is worthwhile.

Computing the dates for Yahrzeit and times for services takes quite a bit of time.

It was great when **Nancy and Myer** were here. At least I could rely on them to write, one, an article giving the essential of what was happening in the community and the other, giving a message from the president's view. Now I have to write these articles – I know, I know ... you will say that my writing is not the best and that I use strange words sometime – true, but I try my best ...

These are not easy times for an administrator of a religious establishment. With COVID it is not easy to decide how to organise the High Holidays services. Some of the congregants are very fearful of what could happen – we, members of the board, try to respect this concern. The **Rabbi** will remove all the prayers that we are not obligated to say, thus making services as short as we can.

Obviously the big problem is the seating. How should we proceed? It is not easy to find the right solution. We have decided to maintain social distancing, thus limiting the number of available seats. However the number of our members has

reached a level where most everyone will be able to find a seat. It could be that at a time we could have a situation where a few people would have to wait till a seat becomes available. If that person is an older person, I am pretty confident that others in the sanctuary will gladly give up their seat. We will have chairs in the lobby and in the Kiddush room where people can sit while waiting for a seat to be made available in the sanctuary.

Please remember to put a sticker by your name when you enter the lobby. A list of names will be set up in the lobby. We are obligated to communicate to the government the names of the families that are in the building.

Because of COVID we had to shut down religious services in April and May. Later, when the government allowed us to open again, I was faced, as Gabbai, with the problem to find every week someone to read the Torah. By some kind of miracle, that search has been successful every Shabbat. We have to be very thankful to five people: **Ury, Eitan-Emmanuel, Arik, Rowen and David**. Thank you all five of you! You have accepted very gracefully every

At about the same time (May 20), Dr. Rowen **Shinder** lost his Mother, **Leatrice Kahansky**, in Montreal. Because of COVID-19, he was unable to leave Moncton. The funeral was held on Zoom, an event that gave us the chance to reconnect with **Rabbi Wolff** who was the Rabbi here from 1982 to 1990.

Services in the synagogue have been held quite regularly since June 5, at least every Shabbat. The Torah has been read thanks to the services of five extraordinary Torah readers, **Ury El, Rowen Shinder, David Miller, Arik Talmasov and Eitan-Emmanuel Izichkis**.

All five are excellent readers; special mention can be made for **Eitan-Emmanuel**. Not yet 15, Eitan-Emmanuel can read perfectly at very high speed. Mazal Tov! Your parents, **Shayna and Alexander** can be proud of you!

We have a special thought for all who are in senior care homes, **Bella, Ann, Max and Ruby**.

Thank you very much **Victoria, Rebbetzin and Anne** for taking care of those who need help and supplying them with delicious meals.

Cheder has continued, interrupted only by the summer vacations. It will restart soon. The **Rebbetzin** has weekly online lessons with some of the kids. She also has a weekly Yiddish class with a few members. Thank you Rebbetzin for your efforts.

Rabbi Yagod has continued to give Dvar Torah and lessons to various members of the community using the Zoom media. Thank you Rabbi.

Her 4 sons, 7 grandchildren, 3 great grandchildren and a large number of friends will remember her fondly. Our more sincere condolences go to the Schelew family.

She was an avid art collector and specifically sought out and supported up and coming New Brunswick artists. Years ago, she donated all of her art collection to Mount Allison University.
